Using a disaster scenario in Masters level preparation of healthcare professionals

Professor Davies will run an interactive workshop on collaborative responses to disasters. This workshop, originally designed for Masters level healthcare students, involves a disaster scenario. Participants will make decisions based on the geographic, socio-economic and disease profiles of a hypothetical country, for instance about a pandemic event. A discussion about the use of the scenario in educating healthcare professionals about disaster planning and preparedness will follow.



Professor Kevin Davies

Brought up in Sydney NSW, Professor Kevin Davies trained as a nurse in South Wales in the late 1970's and subsequently worked in Accident and Emergency. He joined the TA in 1983. He undertook ENB 199 A&E Nursing at Whipps Cross Hospital in 1985. In 1987 he joined the Regular Army and following Sandhurst served in 34 Evacuation Hospital, the Duchess of Kent's Military Hospital in Catterick and 23 Parachute Field Ambulance. On completion of his time in the regular Army Kevin returned to Wales as a lecturer and rejoined the TA. He was appointed a Member of the Royal Red Cross in the Birthday Honours 1997 in recognition of Services to Nursing with the Implementation Force in Bosnia during 1996. Kevin has deployed to many areas of the world including Bosnia, Kenya, Kosovo, Iraq and Afghanistan. He has been the course director for an MSc in Disaster Healthcare for over 10 years and undertakes a full spectrum of teaching and supervision roles across the Faculty. He has held a number of command appointments and is currently Deputy Commander of 160 (Wales) Brigade having completed a tenure as CO 203 (Welsh) Field Hospital (V). Among his professional qualifications he has an MA in Sports Science PhD. He is a Queens Honorary Nurse.
